The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) provides notice of and requests public comment on the EPA's proposed action relating to the Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) permit application for the Energy Transfer Partners Mont Belvieu Gas Plant. EPA is issuing notice of a draft PSD permit for the Energy Transfer Partners facility that if finalized would regulate the greenhouse gas (GHG) air pollutant emissions associated with the project to modify an existing fractionation train and construct a second fractionation train in accordance with the PSD regulation (40 CFR 52.21). The installation of the new equipment will occur at the existing facility, which is located at 10030 A. FM 1942 Mont Belvieu, TX 77580.

Under the provisions of 40 CFR 52.21 (except paragraph (a)(1)), EPA region 6 implements a GHG Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) for Texas. See 40 CFR 52.2305. EPA concludes that Energy Transfer Partners' application is subject to PSD review, as the project will result in increased greenhouse gas emissions for a facility described at 40 CFR 52.21(b)(49)(iv). The proposed project consists of the construction of a second fractionation train that will include an amine unit, mole sieve unit, deo-butanizer unit, deethanizer distillation columns, debutanizer distillation columns, and a depropanizer unit. Modifications to the existing train include the installation of new hot oil and regeneration heaters, and modification to the thermal oxidizer. The project will also add a flare to control fugitives from both fractionation trains. A cooling water heat exchange system, tanks, and electric driven compressors will also be constructed, but are not sources of GHG emissions subject to PSD review.

Any interested individual may submit written comments on EPA's proposed PSD permit for the project. All written comments on EPA's proposed action must be received by the EPA via email by October 1, 2012, or post-marked by October 1, 2012. EPA will respond to and consider all comments in making the final decision regarding the issuing of the permit. The EPA will not respond to individual commenters directly, and similar comments may be grouped together in the response.

Additionally, all comments will be included in the public docket without change, and may be made available to the public, including any personal information provided, unless the comment includes Confidential Business Information (CBI) or other information whose disclosure is restricted by statute. Thus, CBI or other protected information should be clearly identified as such, and should not be submitted through email. Any emails sent directly to the EPA will capture your email address automatically, which will then be included as a part of the public comment. Please note that an email or postal address must be provided if you wish to receive direct notification of EPA's final decision regarding the permit and responses to comments submitted during the public comment period. An extension of the 30 day comment period may be granted if the request for an extension adequately demonstrates why additional time is required to prepare comments.

Public Hearing:

If there is a significant amount of public interest in the draft permit, the EPA may hold a public hearing. Any requests for a public hearing must be received by the EPA via email or mail by September 24, 2012, and must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Attendance at the public hearing is not required in order to submit written comments. If the EPA determines that there is significant public interest, a public hearing will be held on October 9, 2012 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the following location:

The public comment period will automatically be extended to the close of the public hearing in the event that a public hearing is held. Furthermore, the EPA maintains the right to cancel a public hearing if no request for a public hearing is received by September 24, 2012 or EPA determines that there is not a significant public interest. If the hearing is cancelled, EPA will post an announcement of the cancellation by September 28, 2012 on the EPA's website <http://www.epa.gov/r6/apermit.nst/AirP>. Individuals may also call the EPA at the above contact number to determine if the public hearing has been cancelled.

that, they want justice, they want to hold someone responsible and they hope that increasing the reward from \$5,000 to \$10,000 will bring forth some information.

"Anything the public can do to help, we really appreciate it," said the victim's brother Adan tearfully at a press conference held at Baytown Police Department Tuesday.

Baytown police detective Edgar Elizondo spoke at the press conference as well.

"With no evidence at the scene and no witnesses that could give us a license plate, we need help from the public to solve this," the detective said.

"This dark-colored vehicle should have had damage on the left side," he said.

Adan Garcia offered more tips.

"The person responsible

might have hidden the car for a few days and probably didn't show up for work or somewhere else on July 6," he pointed out. "Somebody should have noticed that."

Several of Garcia's siblings and their spouses, along with his father, attended the press conference in a show of solidarity for him.

His little sister, Perla Orozco, said her brother was a "loving and caring man, a great father and great role model."

"He was my big brother, I looked up to him," she said. "I looked to him for advice and he was there for me."

Adan Garcia recalled a family gathering at his parents' house just days before his brother's death.

"My mother has a pear tree in her yard and Jose was trying to pick some pears," he recalled.

Jose Garcia was one of the shortest of the five brothers and couldn't reach

those pears, though he kept jumping for them while his brothers laughed and teased him.

"I just laughed at him and told him to give up," said Adan. "I told him 'get out of the way, you'll never reach them' and he was laughing too."

"Now we can't do any of those things with him any more," said Adan sadly as his tears began to flow once more. "I miss him. We all miss him."

Man dies in Crosby accident

A 23-year-old man died in a one-vehicle accident in Crosby early Friday.

Cipriano Garcia was driving a white 2001 Cadillac Deville in the 3200 block of U.S. Highway 90 about 2:30 a.m. when he veered and then struck the inside concrete barrier.

According to accident reconstructionist D. Wilkie, Garcia's vehicle then went to the right while spinning sideways. The Cadillac struck the outside

guardrail and kept moving, taking out approximately 85 feet of guardrail before it turned over onto its roof, trapping Garcia in the vehicle.

Authorities said after emergency responders extricated him from the car, Garcia was flown by Life Flight helicopter to Hermann hospital where he was pronounced dead.

The crash is under investigation by the Harris County Sheriff's Office traffic enforcement section.

agreed upon," said Ryan.

In the suit, Ryan listed details of International Paper Company, Waste Management, Inc., Waste Management of Texas, Inc. and McGinnes Industrial Maintenance Corporations' actions, inactions, and silence that led to dioxin exposure to the public and the food supply of Harris County over several decades.

First filed in December 2011, the suit contends that in 1965 toxic wastes from a paper mill was placed into ponds located near the San Jacinto River.

The waste ponds were eventually abandoned and portions of the ponds and their toxic contents became submerged below the San Jacinto River partly due to sustenance.

The chemical wastes include dioxin, widely regarded as one of the world's most toxic chemicals.

According to the lawsuit, historical documents reveal that the abandonment of deteriorating and leaking dioxin waste pits

was planned, purposeful and intentional. The county's lawsuit alleges details of a corporate plan to dispose of toxic "black liquor" into ponds near the shores of the San Jacinto River. Defendants are alleged to have voted to "abandon" pits full of dioxin waste, while company executives rewarded themselves with large bonuses.

The complaint notes that "defendants have left a legacy of pollution in Harris County by causing and allowing dioxin to be released into the San Jacinto River instead of spending the money to properly dispose of their dangerous chemicals. It is appropriate that they now compensate Harris County for the consequences of their choices."

Until the day the river is declared safe, Ryan said his message would be clear.

"I have sued those responsible for this pollution on behalf of the residents of Harris County and we are seeking monetary penalties that can be used to make sure the residents of our area know, without a doubt, that fish caught in the San Jacinto River are not safe to eat," Ryan said.

Courageous Talent.

During the 2011-2012 school year, IMPACT students earned an amazing 2,652 college hours and have an average GPA of 3.1, which is higher than the GPA of the general student population at Lee College.

These students are now juniors and sophomores in high school, and many of them are over half way to an associate degree.

In other business, trustees unanimously passed an ordinance and resolution adopting the 2012-2013 budget.

Goose Creek CISD CFO Pete Pape presented the board with a balanced budget for maintenance and operations that anticipates expenditures of \$169,159,500 and revenue of \$169,159,500.

Trustees also approved - by a 4-3 vote - the purchase of 315 iPads and related infrastructure technology upgrades for students in the IMPACT Early College High School.

The cost of the iPads and related accessories comes to \$303,588.40.

The one-time cost for

infrastructure improvements for the IMPACT meeting space is \$278,670.56.

Trustees Burg, Daniel Blackford and Jimmy Smith voted against, with Trustees Martin, Jenice Coffey, Howard Sampson and Agustin Loreda III voting in favor.

Smith said he was concerned about the appearance of giving students what he thought could best be described as superfluous.

"I'm against it. I don't think they need iPads," he said. "I believe iPads are deemed by many as luxury items and at this time I just don't think the taxpayers are ready for this. It just doesn't look good."

ECHS Principal Karen Smithson said the technology is needed, and Suzanne Heinrich, executive director of school administration, said iPad are currently being used for instruction at both Ross S. Sterling and Robert E. Lee high schools.

Goose Creek CISD Chief Technology Officer Frankie Jackson told trustees that from her research, the applications - or apps - available for iPads are more in line with educational purposes than other smart devices.

from (re)creational boating accidents," Rachel Johnson, communications director with National Safe Boating Council said. "It is imperative to follow boating safety procedures each and every time you're on the water."

Johnson said the loss of life comes from boaters failing to do one simple task.

"Eighty four percent of those who drowned were not wearing life jackets," Johnson said. "Always be wearing a life jacket while on the water."

Debbie Thompson, proprietor of Thompson's Fish Camp in Baytown, said that - plus a little common sense and courtesy - go a long way too.

Thompson said it would be a good idea to know who your boating with, and to make sure the person in charge of everyone's safety has the experience to pilot the boat.

"You'd be amazed at what we've seen here," Thompson said. "And watch out for other boaters."

Thompson mentioned a recent incident that occurred on the water where a group in one boat was pulled by two other boaters, which resulted in injuries to an elderly couple.

Thompson said unless another storm system moves in, the conditions this weekend should be ripe for boating enthusiasts.

"The (hurricane) shouldn't have any affect on the conditions this weekend," Thompson said. "When the storm passes to the Louisiana side, we usually see a lower tide than usual, but that's about it."

According to the United States Coast Guard, the most common causes of boating accidents are operator inattention or improper look-out. Between the two, they caused over 1,000 boating accidents in 2011.

In some cases, this boils down to lack of experience on the part of the driver. In other accidents, this may be the result of other contributing factors, such as alcohol or drug use.

Just like it is illegal to drive a vehicle on land when intoxicated, operating a boat while intoxicated is also a crime, not to mention being extremely dangerous to everyone on the boat and anyone in a nearby boat.

Alcohol and drug use accounted for 129 deaths and another 250 injuries last year in boating accidents across the country. Excessive speed caused another 28 fatal accidents last year and resulted in 321 injuries.

Most of these deaths and injuries could have been avoided had the drivers recognized how dangerous boating can be and how important it is to abide by the rules of the water.

For Thompson, it all comes down to sharing the water responsibly.
