Summary of Revisions in Final Permit

I. Summary of the Formal Public Participation Process

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 6 (EPA) proposed to issue a Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) permit to Guadalupe Power Partners, L.P. (GPP), Guadalupe Generating Station on October 24, 2014. The public comment period on the draft permit began October 24, 2014 and closed on November 24, 2014. EPA announced the public comment period through a public notice published in the Seguin Gazette on October 24, 2014 and on Region 6's website. EPA also notified agencies and municipalities on October 24, 2014 in accordance with 40 CFR Part 124.

The Administrative Record for the draft permit was made available at EPA Region 6's office. EPA also made the draft permit, statement of basis and other supporting documentation available on Region 6's website, and at the Marion Community Library, Marion, Texas.

EPA's public notice for the draft permit also provided the public with notice of the public hearing explaining that it was subject to cancellation if no requests for a hearing were received or if EPA determined that there was not a significant degree of public interest. EPA did not receive any written requests for a public hearing, and the public hearing arrangements were cancelled on November 19, 2014.

II. Revisions In Final Permit

The following is a list of administrative changes for the *Guadalupe Power Partners, L.P. (PSD-TX-1310-GHG) Prevention of Significant Deterioration Permit, Final Permit Conditions*.

Cover Sheet

The cover sheet title "Prevention of Significant Deterioration Permit for Greenhouse Gas Emissions Issued Pursuant to the Requirements at 40 CFR § 52.21" has been modified to state the following:

In accordance with 40 CFR § 124.15(b)(3), this PSD Permit becomes effective 30 days after the service of notice of this final decision unless review is requested on the permit pursuant to 40 CFR § 124.19 immediately upon issuance of this final decision.

This administrative change is made as a result of not receiving any comment during the comment period related to this action.

III. National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA)

On September 5, 2014, EPA sent a letter to the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) requesting concurrence on EPA findings for GPP's cultural survey. The SHPO sent concurrence to the EPA on September 23, 2014.
