**Invenergy Thermal Development, Ector County Energy Center**

**ANNOUNCEMENT OF PROPOSED PERMIT AND PUBLIC HEARING, AND REQUEST  
FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON PROPOSED CLEAN AIR ACT GREENHOUSE GAS  
PREVENTION OF SIGNIFICANT DETERIORATION PRECONSTRUCTION PERMIT**

Public Comment Period April 18, 2014 to May 19, 2014

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) provides notice of and requests public comments on the EPA's proposed action relating to the Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) permit application for the Invenergy Thermal Development, Ector County Energy Center. If finalized, the permit would regulate greenhouse gas (GHG) pollutant emissions associated with the project to construct a new electric generation station in accordance with the PSD regulation (40 CFR § 52.21). The proposed construction is located near Goldsmith, TX 79741 at the following coordinates: 32° 04' 10" N and 102° 35' 08" W.

EPA concludes that the Ector County Energy Center is subject to PSD review for the pollutant GHGs, as the project will result in increased greenhouse gas emissions for a facility described at 40 CFR § 52.21(b)(49)(v). The proposed project consists of the construction of two natural gas-fired combustion turbines, one gas-fired dew-point heater, one diesel firewater pump engine, fugitive circuit breaker emissions and fugitive emissions from various piping components. EPA Region 6 implements a Greenhouse Gas (GHG) PSD Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) for Texas under the provisions of 40 CFR § 52.21 (except paragraph (a)(1)). *See 40 CFR § 52.2305.*

Any interested individual may submit written comments on EPA's proposed PSD permit for the Ector County Energy Center. All comments must be received in writing by May 19, 2014, or postmarked by May 19, 2014, to Anna Milburn at one of the following addresses:

EPA will consider and respond to all comments in making the final decision regarding the issuing of the permit. Similar comments may be grouped together in the response, and the EPA will not respond to individual commenters directly.

Additionally, all comments will be included in the administrative record without change, and may be made available to the public, including any personal information provided, unless the comments includes Confidential Business Information (CBI) or other information whose disclosure is restricted by statute. Thus, CBI or other protected information should be clearly identified as such, and should not be submitted through email. Emails sent directly to the EPA will capture your email address automatically and will be included as part of the public comment. *Please note that an email or postal address must be provided with your comments if you wish to receive responses to comments submitted during the public comment period and direct notification of EPA's final decision regarding the permit.*

An extension of the 30-day comment period may be granted if the request for an extension adequately demonstrates why additional time is required to prepare comments.

**Public Hearing:** If EPA determines that there is a significant amount of public interest in the draft permit, the EPA has the right to hold a public hearing. Any request for a public hearing must be received by the EPA either by email or U.S. mail by May 8, 2014, and must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Attendance at the public hearing is not required in order to submit written comments. **If the EPA determines that there is significant public interest**, a public hearing will be held on May 27, 2014, from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm, at the following location:

If a public hearing is held, the public comment period shall automatically be extended to the close of the public hearing. The EPA maintains the right to cancel a public hearing if no request for a public hearing is received by May 8, 2014, or the EPA determines that there is not significant interest. **If the public hearing is cancelled**, notification of the cancellation will be posted by May 12, 2014, on the EPA's Website <http://yosemite.epa.gov/r6/Apermit.nsf/AirP>. Individuals may also call the EPA at the contact number listed above to determine if the public hearing has been cancelled.

**Permit Documents:** EPA's draft permit, EPA's preliminary determination and statement of basis, Invenergy Thermal Development's permit application and supporting documentation, and comments received from the public, other government agencies, and the applicant during the public comment period become part of the administrative record for the permit. In addition, all data submitted by the applicant is available as a part of the administrative record.
