The United States Environmental Protection Agency
(EPA) provides notice of and requests public comments
on the EPA's proposed action relating to the Prevention
of Significant Deterioration (PSD) permit application for

the South Texas Electric Cooperative, Inc. (STEC), Red Gate Power Plant (Red Gate) project. If finalized, the permit would regulate greenhouse gas (GHG) pollutant emissions associated with construction of the facility. The proposed power plant construction will occur in Hidalgo County at 3428 West FM 490, Edinburg, TX, 78541.

Under the provisions of 40 CFR § 52.21 (except paragraph (a)(1)), EPA Region 6 implements a greenhouse gas PSD Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) for Texas. See 40 CFR § 52.2305. EPA concludes that the application is subject to PSD review for the pollutant GHGs. Granting of a permit to construct the Red Gate facility would allow

STEC to build a new 225 megawatt electric power plant. The construction would include twelve natural gas-fired engines, a firewater pump engine, circuit breakers and a

EPA will consider and respond to all comments in making the final decision regarding the issuing of the permit. Similar comments may be grouped together in the response, and the EPA will not respond to individual commenters directly.

Additionally, all comments will be included in the administrative record without change, and may be made available to the public, including any personal information provided, unless the comment includes Confidential Business Information (CBI) or other information whose disclosure is restricted by statute.

Thus, CBI or other protected information should be clearly identified as such, and should not be submitted through email. Emails sent directly to the EPA will capture your email address automatically and will be included as a part of the public comment. Please note that an email or postal address must be provided with your comments if you wish to receive responses to comments submitted during the public comment period and direct notification of EPA's final decision regarding the permit. An extension of the 30-day comment period may be granted if the request for an extension adequately demonstrates why additional time is required to prepare comments.
