GREENHOUSE GAS
PREVENTION OF SIGNIFICANT
DETERIORATION
PRECONSTRUCTION PERMIT
Public Comment Period April 3,
2013 to May 3, 2013**

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) provides notice of and requests public comment on the EPA's proposed action relating to the Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) permit application for the Targa Gas Processing LLC - Longhorn Gas Plant (LGP), Wise County, Texas. If finalized, the EPA's issuance of a PSD permit would regulate greenhouse gas (GHG) pollutant emissions associated with the construction of a new 200 MMSCF/day gas processing plant in accordance with the PSD regulation (40 CFR 52.21). The proposed construction will occur at the proposed facility located NE on FM51 from US-380, turn left after 5.4 miles and drive 1.25 miles to plant in Wise County, Texas, 76234.

Under the provisions of 40 CFR 52.21 (except paragraph (a)(1)), EPA Region 6 implements a greenhouse gas PSD Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) for Texas. See 40 CFR 52.2305. As the proposed project will result in increased greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions as described at 40 CFR 52.21 (b)(49)(iv), EPA concludes that Targa LGP's application is subject to PSD review for the pollutant GHG emissions. The construction of the new plant covered by the draft permit has the following emission sources: regenerative thermal oxidizer, glycol reboiler, molecular sieve regeneration heater, hot oil heater, two flares, and process fugitives.

Any interested individual may submit written comments on EPA's proposed PSD permit for the LGP project. All comments must be received in writing by May 3, 2013 or post-marked by May 3, 2013 to Kyndall Cox at one of the following addresses:

EPA will consider and respond to all comments in making the final decision regarding the issuing of the permit. Similar comments may be grouped together in the response, and the EPA will not respond to individual commenters directly.

Additionally, all comments will be included in the administrative record without change, and may be made available to the public, including any personal information provided, unless the comment includes Confidential Business Information (CBI) or other information whose disclosure is restricted by statute. Thus, CBI or other protected information should be clearly identified as such, and should not be submitted through email. Emails sent directly to the EPA will capture your email address automatically and will be included as a part of the public comment. *Please note that an email or postal address must be provided with your comments if you wish to receive responses to comments submitted during the public comment period and direct notification of EPA's final decision regarding the permit.*

An extension of the 30-day comment period may be granted if the request for an extension adequately demonstrates why additional time is required to prepare comments.

Public Hearing: If EPA determines that there is a significant amount of public interest in the draft permit, the EPA has the right to hold a public hearing. Any request for a public hearing must be received by the EPA either by email or mail by April 26, 2013, and must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Attendance at the public hearing is not required in order to submit written comments. *If the EPA determines that there is significant public interest,* a public hearing will be held on May 15, 2013 from 5:00pm. to 7:00 pm. at the following location:

If a public hearing is held, the public comment period shall automatically be extended to the close of the public hearing. The EPA maintains the right to cancel a public hearing if no request for a public hearing is received by April 26, 2013 or the EPA determines that there is not a significant interest. *If the public hearing is cancelled,* notification of the cancellation will be posted by May 6, 2013 on the EPA's Website <http://yosemite.epa.gov/r6/Apermit.nsf/AirP>. Individuals may also call the EPA at the contact number listed above to determine if the public hearing has been cancelled.

Permit Documents: EPA's draft permit, EPA's preliminary determination and statement of basis, Targa's permit application and sup-

porting documentation, and comments received from the public, other government agencies, and the applicant during the public comment period become part of the administrative record for the permit. In addition, all data submitted by the applicant is available as a part of the administrative record.
