


Coalmine Mesa / Leupp Chapters

Issue: 4 uranium contaminated sources


Actions:

- 9 Black Falls homes provided cisterns including pilot solar pumps with IHS/USEPA funds and the help of the Forgotten People
- \$450,000 USEPA funds for well in West Leupp
- \$107,000 USEPA funds to NTUA for Coalmine Mesa regulated water hauling point
- Water storage tanks provided by NNDWR/USEPA

Issue: 4 uranium contaminated water sources Actions:

- \$150,000 USEPA funds for Red Mesa water hauling point
- \$7.2M IHS/USEPA funds for 2 phases of regional water line extension from Shiprock to serve 2,000 homes, including 93 homes not connected to piped water












Oljato Chapter

Issue: 2 uranium contaminated water sources Actions:

- \$4.6M IHS/HUD funds for new public water systems
- 128 homes without piped water
- 52 miles of waterline
- October 2010 construction start

Monument Valley proposed waterline extension




Dennehotso Chapter

Issue: 2 uranium contaminated water sources Actions:

- \$5.2M IHS/USEPA/HUD funds for new public water system
- 107 homes without piped water
- 53 miles of waterline
- October 2010 construction start

Mariano Lake Chapter

Issue: 2 uranium contaminated water sources Actions:

- \$1.8M IHS/USEPA funds for North Mariano Lake water line extension
- 58 homes without piped water
- 2012 estimated construction start

Conclusion

- IHS/USEPA/HUD provided over \$23M since 2005 for projects within 10 miles of 18 uranium contaminated water sources:
 - Over 400 water hauling homes to be connected to piped water
 - Up to 3000 homes to be served by Navajo Nation Department of Water Resources water hauling program
