#### Environmental Tip of the Month

#### Tribal Leader Forum on Leveraging Energy Resources and Military Partnerships

The DOE Office of Indian Energy will host a day-long Tribal Leader Forum on November 30 at the EPA Region 9 Office in San Francisco. The forum will be held in conjunction with the 20th Anniversary Annual Tribal/EPA Conference, which will take place at the InterContinental San Francisco hotel on November 27-29, 2012. The seventh in a series of planned DOE Office of Indian Energy-sponsored strategic energy development and investment forums, this Tribal Leader Forum is designed to provide information for tribal leaders on the various aspects and opportunities to promote energy development on tribal lands near military installations. #### New App for Health of Waterways

EPA has a new app and website to help people find information on the condition of thousands of lakes, rivers and streams across the United States from their smart phone, tablet or desktop computer. Available at <u>http://www.epa.gov/mywaterway</u>, the "How's My Waterway" app and website uses GPS technology or a userentered zip code or city name to provide information about the quality of local water bodies. This new app provides easy, user-friendly access to the health of a waterway, whether it is safe for swimming and fishing, and what is being done about any reported problems.

#### Rural Community Assistance Corporation (RCAC)

RCAC is working with a new partner to develop a tribal contact website, a training calendar, and introducing a new program called "TUG" Tribal Utility Governance as well as a tribal utility newsletter. #### Western Sustainable Agriculture Research (SARE)

This program is accepting project proposals through December 5. Two types of Western SARE grants are noteworthy. Producer grants provide up to \$15,000 to a farm or ranch operator and Professional + Producer grants provide up to \$50,000 to an agricultural professional such as a farm advisor working with a group of at least five farm or ranch operators. Projects in both categories must involve producers in every stage of the project, address agricultural sustainability, and include distinctive approaches and creative methods of

#### Environmental Justice (EJ) Small Grants Program

This program is accepting project proposals through January 7, 2013. Federally recognized tribal governments, tribal organizations, and non-profits are eligible to apply for up to \$30,000 to fund collaborative projects to empower their communities to address local environmental and public health issues. The program has funded sustainable agriculture projects in recent years, but the competition for funding is stiff. Tribes that have applied unsuccessfully in the past are welcome to ask the Region 9 Environmental Justice office for a debrief on their application, to learn how to improve their chances in the 2013 proposal evaluation process. #### Federal Excess

The Federal Surplus Personal Property Donation Program (aka GSAXcess or Federal Excess) allows certain organizations, including tribes, to obtain excess federal property the government no longer needs. Equipment available in the system ranges from vehicles, boats, and office furniture to consumable office, field and laboratory supplies and equipment. The goal of the GAP is to assist tribes in developing the capacity to plan and establish environmental protection programs and to develop and implement solid and hazardous waste programs in accordance with their individual needs. The purpose of the NPS Control Program is to assist eligible federally-recognized Indian tribes develop and implement polluted runoff control programs and watershed-based plans that address critical water quality concerns and achieve positive environmental results. #### Funding Available: Source Water Assessment and Protection Program (SWAP)

EPA Region 9 intends to award over \$290,000 through Direct Implementation Tribal Cooperative Agreements (DITCAs) ranging in size from approximately \$25,000 to \$85,000 for SWAP activities. The purpose of the funding will enable federally recognized tribes and eligible tribal consortia within EPA Region 9, who operate at least one public water system (PWS), to identify and assess any possible threats (potential sources of contamination) to their public drinking water supply sources and to develop measures to protect these sources against those threats. Proposals received by March 27, 2013 will be awarded by August 30, 2013.
