



EPA's Electronic Stormwater Notice of Intent (eNOI) Home Page

EPA has updated and improved the Electronic Notice of Intent (eNOI) for construction sites and industrial facilities that need to apply for coverage under EPA's Construction General Permit (CGP) or Multi-Sector General Permit (MSGP). The eNOI system is a free online service. Use this system only if your construction site or industrial facility is located in a state in which EPA is the permitting authority. Please click the eNOI logo to start to file an electronic Notice of Intent.

Glossary

As of October 31st, 2009, the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation is now the stormwater permitting authority in Alaska EXIT Disclaimer. Please go to their website to find out how to submit your Notice of Intent.

Attention operators with permit coverage under the 2003 Construction General Permit (CGP): Construction site operators with permit coverage under the 2003 CGP may continue to operate under the terms of conditions of that permit and do not need to file a new NOI. The 2008 CGP has been issued for a two-year time period and applies only to new discharges. If your construction project is covered under the 2003 CGP, you do not need to file an NOI for coverage under the 2008 CGP and you must continue to comply with the terms and conditions of the 2003 CGP. For more information on the 2008 CGP see the EPA Construction General Permit page.

View Stormwater NOIs - EPA is posting construction and industrial NOIs for states and territories covered by EPA's CGP and MSGP. You can use this page to search, sort, and view your NOI or other forms.

Registration and Training

NPDES Topics

Industrial facilities and construction sites can apply for coverage under EPA's MSGP or CGP via the eNOI system. First time users must register to gain access to use the eNOI system. See Registering for eNOI (PDF) (2 pp, 222KB) to learn how to begin this process. Federal regulations require the certification of Notice of Intent forms by a responsible corporate officer or a principle executive or ranking elected official (for government organizations). If you are a Certifying Official and do not have an eNOI account, you must register through EPA's CDX interface. Go to eNOI Certifying Officials (PDF) (2 pp, 110KB) for more information on certifying officials. EPA has developed the Reporting 2008 MSGP Monitoring Data (PDF) (3 pp, 724KB) quidance document for industrial facilities that wish to submit their monitoring data electronically.




